#### Checklist: Before You Leave Home

# YOU WILL NEED TO PRESENT A VALID PASSPORT AND VALID GOVERNMENT-ISSUED IDENTIFICATION TO BOARD THE SHIP.

You will have received an email with your cruise confirmation/booking number and instructions for Royal Caribbean's online cruise check-in. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE CRUISE CHECK-IN AT LEAST THREE (3) DAYS PRIOR TO SAILING. Go to www. royalcaribbean.com/onlinecheckin and follow the instructions. Online you will fill out your Set Sail Pass and print out your Cruise Stateroom Tags. DO NOT PUT THESE TAGS ON YOUR LUGGAGE PRIOR TO ARRIVING IN FLORIDA.

In addition to the Cruise Stateroom Tags that you will have printed online, please pay attention to the specially designed *MARY KAY* luggage tags provided in your travel packet. BEFORE YOU LEAVE HOME, PLEASE PUT THESE MARY KAY LUGGAGE TAGS ON YOUR CHECKED LUGGAGE.

Your stateroom will be ready at 1:30 p.m. on embarkation day. Pack a small carry-on bag with travel documents, extra clothes, bathing suit, shorts and any medications you need so you do not have to wait for your checked bags to arrive in your stateroom before going out to enjoy the ship's facilities.

Do not pack clothes irons; they are confiscated.

Plan your electronics; all staterooms are outfitted with a 110-volt, 60-cycle alternating current (AC) with standard U.S. plug fittings.

Plan for phone calls: Calls from the ship are expensive. Your cell phone is the best choice. You will need to contact your provider prior to leaving the U.S. to add an International calling plan.

## **Airline Schedule**

Your flight itinerary is enclosed in this travel packet. Due to increased security measures, please plan to arrive at the airport at least 2 1/2 hours before your departure. Be sure the name on your airline itinerary exactly matches the name on the government-issued photo ID that you will use at the airport.

When you arrive and depart on the cruise dates, your transportation will be provided for you by 360 Destination Management Company.
